Honors-By-Contract (HBC)



Honors-by-Contract (HBC) provides honors students an opportunity to earn honors credit by integrating an honors experience into a regular (non-honors) course. The contract is the product of a collaborative agreement between the student and the instructor on the structure and expectations of the honors-level work to be completed. Students are limited to a maximum of 2 HBCs per semester; special consideration may be provided only in exceptional circumstances for an additional HBC. It is the student's responsibility to distribute the HBCs within their degree plan and their academic program.

Characteristics of an Honors-by-Contract

- Focus is on enriched content / skills in terms of depth and/or complexity; not just increased volume
- Mutual benefit for student and instructor
- Faculty mentorship of student including regularly scheduled meetings
- Calendar of due dates for elements of the honors work
- Clearly stated assignment type (e.g., report, journal, paper, product, presentation, performance, exhibition, service etc.) as well as criteria for assessment (e.g., page length, quality of argument, formatting requirements, etc.)

Development of an Honors-by-Contract

- Think creatively about what you would like to learn beyond the course content
- Meet with your instructor in the first week of classes to discuss ideas for a contract
- Work with the instructor to write a 250-word description of the project you will do and how
 it will be assessed
- Complete the Honors-by-Contract (HBC) form and attach a copy of the regular course syllabus, along with the 250-word description mentioned above
- Sign the form and have your instructor sign the form
- Submit the HBC contract and attached forms to the Honors College office within 3 weeks of the first day of the semester
- Consult with the Honors College if you have questions about the contract

Credit for an Honors-by-Contract

- Complete the honors contract plus the regular course requirements with a letter grade of "A" or "B"
- Have your instructor submit the Honors-by-Contract Evaluation Form to the Honors College during the end-of-semester exam period to receive credit; without the form no credit is provided
- Notify your instructor and the Honors College Dean if you wish to cancel the contract before the last day of classes
- If regular course requirements are fulfilled but the Honors-by-Contract is not, you will receive regular course credit but no honors credit.
